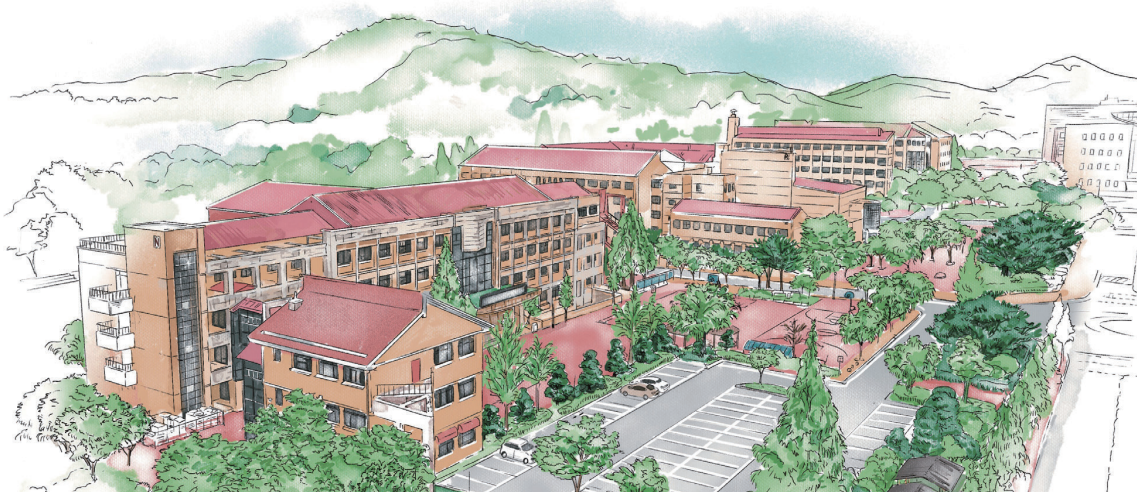

Eligibility Requirements and Evaluation Criteria

A. Eligibility Requirements

1) Freshman Admission

Eligibility Requirements	Eligibility
Foreign nationals whose both parents are non-Korean	Foreign students whose both parents are non-Korean nationals (dual citizenship holders are not eligible)

Korean Language Proficiency Requirement (TOPIK)

Applicants who are foreign nationals whose both parents are non-Korean must meet one of the following Korean language requirements: Hold a TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean) Level 3 or higher administered by the National Institute for International Education (NIIED), or Pass the M-TOPIK Level 3 or higher, the Korean Language Proficiency Test administered by the Mokwon University Institute of International Education. However, applicants to arts and physical education programs are eligible with: TOPIK Level 2 or higher, or M-TOPIK Level 2 or higher administered by the Mokwon University Institute of International Education.

English Language Proficiency Requirement (for the Division of Global Convergence Studies – English Track)

Applicants who are foreign nationals whose both parents are non-Korean must meet one of the following requirements: Obtain a minimum English proficiency score of: TOEFL PBT 530 / CBT 197 / iBT 71, or IELTS 5.5, or CEFR Level B2, or TEPS 600 or higher; or demonstrate equivalent English proficiency recognized by Mokwon University. Applicants who are citizens of English-speaking or semi-English-speaking countries and have completed secondary education conducted in English in those countries are eligible. Applicants who have completed at least two years of middle or high school education (total of six years) in institutions where the medium of instruction is English, and can provide official documentation from the school principal verifying this, are also eligible.

2) Transfer Admission

Korean Language Proficiency Requirement (TOPIK)

Applicants who are foreign nationals whose both parents are non-Korean must meet one of the following Korean language requirements: Hold a TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean) Level 3 or higher administered by the National Institute for International Education (NIIED), or Pass the M-TOPIK Level 3 or higher, the Korean Language Proficiency Test administered by the Mokwon University Institute of International Education. However, applicants to arts and physical education programs are eligible with: TOPIK Level 2 or higher, or M-TOPIK Level 2 or higher administered by the Mokwon University Institute of International Education.

Transfer to the 3rd Year

Those who have completed at least two years (four semesters) and earned the required credits at a four-year university. Those who have graduated (or are expected to graduate) from a two- or three-year junior college, having earned the required credits for graduation.

Transfer to the 4th Year

Those who have graduated (or are expected to graduate) from a three-year junior college, having earned the required credits for graduation.

Admission is limited to applicants applying for a department similar to their previous field of study.

Transfer to the 4th Year [3+1 Dual Language Program]

- Admission Requirements: Applicants who have graduated (or are expected to graduate) from a three-year junior college in a related field of study are eligible for transfer to the 4th year.
 - Korean Language Proficiency (TOPIK): Applicants are required to take Mokwon University's own Korean language proficiency test for both admission and graduation evaluation purposes.
- Dual Language Program: This program refers to a bachelor's degree curriculum in which 50% or more of the total required credits are offered in a foreign language (or in Korean with simultaneous interpretation into a foreign language).
- Only applicants from countries where Chinese is an official or commonly used language are eligible, regardless of Korean language proficiency.
- Admission is limited to applicants applying for a department similar to their previous field of study.

B. Evaluation Criteria for Eligibility

- 1) To prevent fraudulent, irregular, or unfair admissions practices, applicants must have completed the entire curriculum equivalent to 12 years of formal education under the Korean education system. However, if a discrepancy arises due to differences in the educational systems of other countries, a deficiency of up to one semester (six months) may be accepted. (Applicants must have completed at least 11 years and 6 months, equivalent to 23 semesters in total.)
- 2) In cases where a parent is divorced or deceased, the nationality of the divorced or deceased parent is not considered in determining eligibility.
- 3) Academic credentials obtained through alternative means such as the GED (qualification exam), homeschooling, or online/cyber learning programs are not recognized for admission eligibility.

- A. All pieces for the practical examination must be performed or sung from memory (no sheet music allowed).
- B. For applicants to the Division of Performing Arts – Vocal & Musical Theatre Major (Vocal), art songs or opera arias must be performed in the original key and language.
- C. For applicants to the Division of Performing Arts – Vocal & Musical Theatre Major (Musical) and the Division of Applied Music, if using an MR (music accompaniment), the file must be prepared in an audio format (e.g., MP3) and submitted on a USB drive along with an extra backup file on the day of the examination.
- D. For the Division of Applied Music – Instrumental Major, the bass part may be performed on either an electric bass guitar or a double bass.
- E. For the Division of Applied Music – Music Production (M.P.) Major, applicants must submit one original work saved as an audio file on a USB drive.

Evaluation Principles

- A. For general departments (divisions), successful applicants are selected in order of total score, based on the evaluation ratio, and then by age (younger applicants given priority) in case of a tie. However, for arts and physical education departments, applicants are selected in order of practical examination score and then interview score.

- B. Applicants must attend both the interview and the practical examination.
Failure to attend either will result in disqualification.
- C. Applicants to the College of Fine Arts and Design, College of Webtoon, Animation and Game, Department of Sports and Health Management, Division of Theatre, Film and Media Arts, and Division of Global Convergence Studies will be disqualified if their interview score is below 60% of the total possible score.
- D. Applicants to the College of Music will not be admitted if their average practical examination score is below 60 points out of 100.
- E. Any matters not specified in this admissions guideline will be determined separately by the Mokwon University Admissions Management Committee.
